1. Purpose. To update mission and functions of Naval Consolidated Brig (NAVCONBRIG) Miramar, CA per reference (a).

2. Cancellation. BUPERSINST 5450.47B.

3. Status and Command Relationships. NAVCONBRIG Miramar is a shore activity in an active, fully operational status under a commanding officer.

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4. Action. Commanding Officer, NAVCONBRIG Miramar shall ensure performance of mission and functions contained in enclosure (1). 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**MISSION AND FUNCTIONS OF
NAVAL CONSOLIDATED BRIG MIRAMAR**

MISSION

To ensure the security, good order, discipline, and safety of pre-trial and post-trial prisoners; to retain and restore the maximum number of personnel to honorable service; and to prepare prisoners for return to civilian life as productive citizens.

FUNCTIONS

1. Serve as Department of Defense (DoD) Level I and II confinement facility for DoD male and female pre- and post-trial prisoners and as DoD female Level III confinement facility, providing a secure, safe, and humane environment for prisoners and staff according to the U.S. Code, applicable DoD, Department of the Navy, Navy correctional regulations, and standards of the American Correctional Association for adult correctional institutions.
2. Maintain a high level of military discipline within brig operations.
3. Prepare prisoners for return to active duty or for discharge from military service and return to civilian life.
4. Provide resources and an environment which allow prisoners to:
 - a. serve sentences imposed by the court;
 - b. fulfill individual responsibilities; and
 - c. complete plans for restoration or return to duty or return to civilian life.
5. Operate gender-responsive retraining programs which include: work; academic, vocational, military, and physical training; social skills and motivation; individual and group counseling; substance abuse (drug and alcohol) treatment programs; sexual offender and violent offender and anger management treatment; religion; and brig industries.
6. Provide required reports to assist Commander, Navy Personnel Command in gathering and evaluating data concerning administration, operations programs, and management of the consolidated brig.

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7. Provide military escort services for adjudged prisoners, deserters, and supervised released violators when required.
8. Manage public-safety programs to include victim witness assistance, sex offender notification, DNA sample collection, parole revocations, and supervised release.
9. Serves as Navy Corrections' "model manager" for policy, program development, and consultant services for the following programs:
 - a. Brig Officer Management Seminar
 - b. Womens' corrections
 - c. Specialized correctional treatment (behavioral and mental health)
 - d. Prisoner reentry
10. Provide policy and procedural guidance and command supervision to detachments at Pearl Harbor, HI; Bremerton, WA, and Lewis-McChord, WA.
